***Abstract***

*Whereas existing legal responses (imprisonment and cash penalties) have not been able to reduce the offences on the environment, the earth is facing destruction, therefore introducing a new mechanism that guarantees the revival of the natural resources is really imperative.*

*In this mechanism, in addition to the penalties to paid for the breach of law and the damages incurred, the culprit will forced to pay a cost as much as several times of the damages to the specialized NGOs in order to remedy the damages with the aim of participation of the local communities and repair of the damaged parts.*
